







Things you'll need:

Paper plate
Pens, crayons or paint
A split pin
Paper or card



1. Draw two lines on your paper plate to create four sections.



2. Let your child draw a different weather condition in each section. We chose 'sunny, 'windy', 'cloudy' and 'thunder storms'.



3. Cut an arrow out of your paper or card and make a hole at end of the arrow for the split pin to go through.



4. Make another hole in the centre of your paper plate and attach your arrow using the split pin.

Top Tip

- Look out the window and help your child decide where the arrow should point to.
- Talk about the different kinds of weather, rain, sun, snow etc.
- Talk to your child about the different seasons i.e. autumn the leaves change colour and fall from the trees, spring plants start to grow and lambs are born.
